Students were able to attend educational sessions, hear from insurance executives, network, and enjoy the great city of San Diego. The students volunteered at local schools fixing decks & yards and attended receptions at Petco Park, the USS Midway and other venues around the city.

13th Annual NAPSLO Symposium

The 13th Extreme Risk Takers NAPSLO Symposium was held in Chicago and hosted by the Derek Hughes/NAPSLO Educational Foundation, the Alpha Kappa Chapter of Gamma lota Sigma and the Katie School of Insurance at Illinois State University on the weekend of March 18th-20th. Over 125 students from 17 different universities across the U.S. attended the conference. The symposium began with a career fair with 16 great companies looking to hire the students. There were seven different sessions throughout the weekend ranging from The Foundation, NAPLSO and You; Overview of the Surplus Lines; Intermediaries in the Surplus Lines Market; How D&O Business Works in Conjunction with the E&S Market; Case Study on Risk Management; Lloyd's and the Global Market; and Roles and Career Paths in the Surplus Lines Market. The NAPSLO Symposium also allowed students to network with RMI students who share the same interest in a career in the risk management and insurance industry. During the evening, the students socialized and watched the NCAA basketball games at Lucky Strike and RB Grille. A special thanks to NAPSLO and the Derek Hughes/NAPSLO Educational Foundation for the support to offer this Symposium to future industry leaders.






